# Vinsen Thoppil Samuel

AUGUST 5<sup>TH</sup>, 1983 – MARCH 5<sup>TH</sup>, 2024

Vinsen Thoppil Samuel, born to the late Samuel Thoppil and Rajamma Thoppil, embarked on his journey through life on August 5, 1983, in the loving company of his twin brother, Linsen, older sister Suni, older brother Victor, and devoted parents. Raised in a home filled with faith and love, Vinsen's early scholastic talents paved the way for his admission to a school for gifted students, setting the stage for a lifetime of achievements and meaningful relationships.



The Samuel family's relocation to Floral Park, NY, marked a period of flourishing for Vinsen and Linsen, culminating in their admission to the Bronx High School of Science. Vinsen furthered his education at Hunter College, earning a Bachelor's degree, and completed his Masters in Public Administration from John Jay College of Criminal Justice. His career trajectory took a significant turn in 2008 when he joined the United Nations, where he not only found professional fulfillment but also met his life partner, Kavita Ramnarine. Their union was celebrated in a beautiful ceremony in NYC on September 15, 2018.



At the UN, Vinsen was known for his impact, embodying the ethos of dedication, compassion, and conscientiousness. His work, particularly his contributions to the preparations for the International Conference on Small Island Developing States (SIDS4) to take place May 28-30, underscored his commitment to addressing global development challenges.

Vinsen's passion for his work was matched only by his love for his wife, family, friends, and the joys of life, from fashion to cuisine, music, and travel.

Tragically, Vinsen's journey was cut short on March 5, 2024, by a sudden cardiac event in St. John, Antigua, where he was preparing for the SIDS4 conference. His passing has left an indelible void in the hearts of those he touched, particularly his wife Kavita, mother Rajamma, siblings, and extended family, who remember him as a beacon of love, laughter, and kindness. Vinsen's legacy is a testament to the profound impact one individual can have on their world.





His life, though too brief, was a tapestry of love, adventure, and a relentless pursuit of making a difference. As we celebrate Vinsen Thoppil Samuel, we remember not just the moment of his departure but the multitude of moments that he shared with us, enriching our lives with his presence.
